
John Hutchinson compiled this document in the fall of 2015. The principal outside sources for grandparent's and great grandparent's history are from earlier family documents prepared by Robert Connor and John Connor. Sources for even earlier generations are found on the Internet, mostly Ancestry.com.

There are several events in Irish history that make it more difficult to trace our Irish ancestors. The Test Act of 1703 mandated that all office holders in Ireland use "sacraments as prescribed by the established church." The established church being the Church of Ireland. Local bishops declared that marriages performed by dissenting ministers or priests were null and void making their children incapable of succeeding to their estates. As a result many Catholic marriage records for this time were not part of the Public Records.

On June 30 1922, during the Irish Civil War, the Public Records Office of Ireland, located at the historic Four Courts in Dublin, was severely damaged by fire resulting in the loss of a huge number of records. The fire began during an assault by Government forces on the Four Courts building, which had been occupied by the IRA.

Charles Frances Connor and Mary Elizabeth (Bess) Dagnia

Charles Frances Connor was born on July 9, 1876 in Lenexa, Kansas, the sixth child of the nine children of John Joseph Connor and Mary Christopher Connor. Charles died on November 30, 1954 in Wichita Kansas. Mary Elizabeth (Bess) Dagnia was born on November 29, 1884 in Denver Colorado to George R. Dagnia and Mary McGrath, the first of two girls. Charles and Bess were married on July 7, 1905 in Rosedale, Kansas. They had nine children (7 boys, 2 girls) Mary Louise, John Joseph, Charles Edward, James Arthur, Ella Gertrude, Robert Anthony, Raymond (Pete) Frances, Francis Ignatius, William Matthew. They had one set of twins (Raymond and Bob), nicknamed Pete and Repeat. One child Francis Ignatius died at age five from an eye tumor.

Early in their marriage Charles worked outside of Lenexa and Bess depended on the oldest girl, Mary Louise, to help mind the other children. Bess also contracted the very dangerous flu that afflicted almost every family around that time. Until 1919 the family lived at 1040 State Line in Rosedale, Kansas. Mary Louise, John, and Charles were born in this house.

In 1919 Charles found work in Wichita and eventually Bess came to Wichita on the train with Ella to find a place to live. Mary Louise was left in charge of the boys. There is a story that the train ride was too much for Ella who threw up on the train and in a restaurant. The entire family moved to Wichita in 1920.

The family lived in a rented home at 348 Ohio. The home was on the edge of what was then known as Mathewson Pasture, an area used as a public park by many Wichita children at the time. The pasture also hosted carnivals and circuses.

Before 1929 the family moved to a much larger rental home at 1339 North Topeka. The house had four bedrooms and a large sleeping porch. They were in Cathedral parish and had many well

known old Catholic Wichita families as neighbors (Hagan, Norton, Basham, Braunagles, Wallace, Jones, and Chrisman) who had lots of kids.

Despite the Great Depression the family lived fairly comfortably with Charles, his brother Matthew, and his sons very busy with their plumbing work. In 1935 they started a plumbing company in partnership with J.G. Ripstraw. By this time John and James were a big part of the plumbing and heating business. They had contracts for the construction of Wichita North High School, the Hillcrest Apartments, the Orpheum Theater, and the Veterans Administration Hospital.

Bess was kept very busy with her large family and church organizations. She was a founding member of the Monica Circle, a Catholic women's service organization. The nineteen forties were especially difficult for Charles and Bess and the rest of their family with four sons (John, Pete, Bob, and William) in the military scattered across the United States, Europe, Philippines, and India. All came home safely with one son (Pete) injured by shrapnel and briefly missing in action in Italy.

One of the family highlights was the annual Memorial Day picnic held at the home of Bill and Florence Connor. All of the Wichita family attended and a good time was had by all.

Mary Louise never married and continued to live at home and help her mother and father. After Charles retired he gardened and entertained grandchildren. He especially liked to play checkers with his grandchildren. As he grew older his heart began to fail and he eventually died of heart complications in 1954.

Bess continued to live with Mary Louise and enjoy sewing and her many grandchildren. As she entered her eighties her health slowly began to fail and she spent her last few years in a nursing home. She died in 1972. Both Charles and Bess are buried in Calvary Cemetery in Wichita, Kansas.

In later years Charles and Bess were known to their family as Grandmother Connor and Pop Connor. They had twenty-five grandchildren. Grandmother Connor was often called into service to take care of grandchildren. In the fall of 1954 she took care of the Hutchinson children for several weeks while her daughter Ella was with her husband while he was temporarily assigned to Boeing Seattle.

Great Grand Parents

John Joseph Connor and Mary Jane Christopher

John Joseph Connor was born July 4, 1833 in County Wexford, Ireland to Bryan O'Connor and Mary Keegan. While in his late teens he left home with two of his older brothers, James and Thaddeus Jeremiah, known as Jeremiah and sailed to the United States. The brothers spent a few years in Jo Daviess County (near Galena), in southwest Illinois, where they became United States citizens. By 1859 John and James were living in Westport, Missouri. In 1866 John, his wife, Mary Jane Christopher and James settled a farm on land that is located west of the present Pflumm Road, between 99th and 103rd Streets, in Lenexa, Kansas. Mary Jane was born in 1849 in County Wexford, Ireland to James Christopher and Ellen Powers.

FAMILY BACKGROUND

John's parents were Bryan O'Connor of Wexford, Ireland and Mary Keegan of Oilgate, Ireland. They lived on a farm outside Wexford called Garryhubback, which is Gaelic for "tobacco garden." The farm is still owned and occupied by O'Connor descendants who have been host to several of John's descendants who have visited from the Kansas City area. Bryan and Mary's Children were Jeremiah, James, Matthew, Johanna, John, Lawrence, Mary, and Catherine. In addition to farming, the family ran a small hotel and restaurant.

EARLY YEARS IN AMERICA

In the late 1840s or early 1850s, James, John and Jeremiah sailed to the United States. It was reported in his obituary that John left Ireland when he was eighteen years old, which would have been 1851. According to James' citizenship papers, he declared intent to become a United States citizen in 1849. It is not known if this was done before or after arriving in the United States. The brothers became citizens of the United States while living in Jo Daviess County, Illinois. From the dates appearing on the citizenship papers granted to James and John, it appears that the brothers lived in Jo Daviess County from at least 1854 to 1857. By 1859 James and John were reportedly living in Westport, Missouri, while Jeremiah had settled in the Toronto, Ontario, Canada area with his wife Mary Lynch.

In the fall of 1862 John and James served in the Civil War with the 77th Regiment, Company C, of the Missouri militia.

Little is known about how the Connor brothers met the Christopher family. James and Ellen Christopher were natives of Armore, County Waterford, Ireland. In 1849, while living in Maine, their daughter Mary was born. The 1885 Kansas census reports that both John and Mary came to Kansas from Illinois. Given Mary's age, it is unlikely that they married until after the Civil War. Family tradition holds that John, Mary and James considered moving to Oregon, but then heard there was good farmland available in Johnson County, Kansas, a few miles to the southwest, and decided to settle there.

THE CONNOR FAMILY IN LENEXA

By 1866 John and Mary Connor, along with John's brother James, had settled an 80-acre farm one mile south of the future site of downtown Lenexa. In 1868, John and Mary's first child, Bernard, was born. Also in 1868 the Connors deeded one acre of the farm to School District 46. This was the origin of public education in Lenexa. The school remained on the Connor farm until the early 1880s, when it moved to a building in town.

In 1869, the Kansas City, Fort Scott and Gulf Railroad Company acquired an easement through the area and also acquired two acres from Charles Bradshaw, a prominent local landowner, to build a station. That same year the plat for the town of Lenexa was filed. The town site was laid out on land north of the station that had also been owned by Bradshaw.

In addition John and Mary's second child, Ellen, was born in 1869. By the late 1870s, the farm had grown to 160 acres. The Connors acquired the 80 acres to the west of their farm, which had originally been settled by the Rush family. John and Mary raised nine children on the farm.

The Connor family was among the original parishioners of Lenexa's Holy Trinity Catholic Church, which began in 1880 as a mission to the Lenexa area serving about twenty families. It was served by priests from St. Joseph's parish in Shawnee, Kansas. The original wood frame church was built in the early 1880s. In 1906 a full time pastor was assigned to the parish. By 1910, the parish had grown to over sixty families and was in need of a larger church. A building contract was given to James Connor, who had become a stonemason and contractor. The dedication of that church in November 1911 inspired one of John Connor's poems, "The Dedication." The poem was written on June 2, 1912 and copied from the original by his daughter-in-law Bess Connor.

The splendid sermon that was preached it was a great expounder of the doctrines the apostles teached and Christ himself was founder.

To our reverend pastor great praise is due and likewise all his people to build a church so fair to view from cornerstone to steeple.

Great sacrifices we know it took from men of every station we pray that God will send good luck upon the congregation

and bless the generous giving hand that is famed in song and story that built this church so great and grand for God's eternal glory.

John Connor was involved for many years with the local school district. He was a member of the school board and, according to at least one newspaper report, was "at all times active in school matters." He also served as Lenexa's postmaster from 1893 to 1896.

In the late 1800s, the family ran a store in town known as Connor & Sons. In the spring of 1895, Connor & Sons built an impressive new two story, brick building on Walnut Street, just south of the depot. The lower floor included the storeroom and the local telegraph and post offices. The upper floor was used as a public hall, and was known as Connor's hall. It was the scene of many of Lenexa's social events, including dances and masquerade balls. By early 1897, the storeroom

was leased to Hart Brothers, new merchants in town. In early February 1887, a fire, originating in the storeroom, destroyed the building. There was also damage to adjacent buildings, and a newspaper report called it the most devastating fire in the town's history.

John Connor was well regarded in the area as a speaker and poet. He wrote a number of poems dealing with the school and other local events, and often spoke or recited his poems at school commencements and other public gatherings. In 1899, one of the largest gatherings in the history of Lenexa took place to honor the return of William Cornatzer from service in the Philippines during the Spanish-American War. On this occasion John Connor gave a patriotic address and recited an original poem. The poem was published in the Olathe paper, as were a few of his other poems.

John Connor died on December 8, 1915, at the age of eighty-two. Mary died on February 19, 1916, a few months later. They were buried in the family plot at the Catholic cemetery in Shawnee with John's brother James, Mayme, and Ellen, who had died in 1914.

 - vii. Mary Elizabeth Connor was born and died on March 26, 1949 in Illinois.

- 2. Ella Gertrude Connor was born May 29, 1869 and died April 4, 1914 in Rosedale, Kansas. Also called Ellen. She married William P. Riley on February 22, 1898, a former Olathe boy who was successfully farming in Drexel, Missouri. He was born in January of 1866 in Illinois. The wedding took place at Holy Trinity Church, with a reception following at the Connor family home. The choir from St. Paul's parish in Olathe sang at the wedding. They also later moved to Rosedale.
- 3. James L. Connor was born October 17, 1870 in Oxford Township, Johnson, Kansas and died April 6, 1930 in Shawnee, Kansas. He was unmarried and spent most of his life living on the farm he settled with John and Mary. He was known to the family and the Lenexa community as "Uncle Jimmy." The Lenexa Catholic stone church on the southwest corner of 91st Terrace and Pflumm Road was built for \$16,000. The contract was let to James Connor of Rosedale, Kansas. The 1911 church was dedicated on Thanksgiving Day by the Rt. Rev. John Ward.
- 4. Matthew P. Connor was born June 29, 1873 in Oxford Township, Johnson, Kansas and died December 1, 1939 in St. Joseph, Missouri. He married Effie Carter on May 23, 1895 in Olathe, Kansas. Matthew was called one of Lenexa's "most promising young merchants." The couple resided at Lenexa initially, and later moved to Rosedale, Kansas.
 - a. Ethel Marianna Connor was born April 13, 1897 in Rosedale, Kansas and died in October 1980 in Kansas City, Kansas. She married Dean J. Swalwell in 1920 in Johnson County, Kansas.

- 5. John J. Connor was born July 7, 1874 in Oxford Township, Johnson, Kansas and died January 3, 1956. He married Anna May Flourney on March 4, 1897 in Oak Grove, Missouri. They moved to a rented farm in Drexel, Missouri. In the 1920 census was an electrical contractor.
 - a. Ruby M. Connor was born March 1, 1896 in Kansas. She married Leo W. Burnett. He was born in August 1884 in Missouri.
 - i. Mary Jean Burnett was born about 1925 in Missouri.
 - b. Lawrence Connor was born in 1902 in Kansas.
- 6. **Charles Francis Connor** was born July 9, 1876 in Lenexa, Kansas and died November 30, 1954 in Wichita, Kansas. He married **Mary Elizabeth Dagnia** on July 7, 1905 in Rosedale, Kansas. She was born November 29, 1884 in Denver, Colorado and died November 30, 1972 in Wichita, Kansas.
- 7. Edward Thomas Connor was born December 4, 1879 in Oxford Township, Johnson, Kansas and died May 10, 1955. He married Nancy Alice Campbell in 1912 in Kansas. She was born October 5, 1887 in Nebraska and died May 1, 1951. In 1930 census was a restaurant owner.
 - a. Vincent E. Connor was born June 12, 1913 in Kansas and died November 21 1996 in Cape Girardeau, Missouri. He married Ruby Waynona Carman on December 13, 1941 in Dodge City, Kansas.
- 8. Mayme Connor was born November 27, 1881 and died November 15, 1908 in Shawnee, Kansas. She married Jack T. Loftus in November 1907. Nearly one year later Mamie died after delivering their first child. The baby survived only a few hours. According to the Lenexa newspaper, the entire town grieved her death.
- 9. Arthur William Connor was born June 2, 1887 in Kansas and died July 13, 1941 in Shawnee, Kansas. He married Ruby Cecilia Francouer on June 28, 1916 in Kansas City, Missouri.
 - a. Mary Philomene "Pum" Connor was born February 17, 1918 in Missouri and died March 29, 2002 in Bemidji, Minnesota. She married Philip A. Koury. He was born June 7, 1911 in Missouri and died December 26, 1999 in Shawnee Mission, Kansas.
 - b. William Benedict Connor was born August 26, 1920 in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri and died July 28, 1967 in Long Island, New York.
 - c. Joan Cecelia "Jodie" Connor was born November 21, 1922 in Jackson County, Missouri and died December 2, 2009 in Shawnee Mission, Kansas. She married Francis A. Kellerman. He was born December 17, 1916 in Missouri and died in May 1977 in Jackson County, Missouri.
 - d. Elizabeth Ann Connor was born November 13, 1925 in Kansas City, Missouri and died September 4, 2006. She married James E. Monahan on June 12, 1948 in Jackson County, Missouri. He was born in 1924.

- e. Genevieve Eileen "Genny" Connor was born February 14, 1927 in Jackson County, Missouri and died August 18, 2012 in Olathe, Kansas. She married George T. O'Laughlin on February 16, 1952 in Jackson County, Missouri.
 - i. Rita Ann O'Laughlin was born in 1953 and married David Durant.
 - ii. Jean Clare O'Laughlin was born about 1961 and married David Chesney.
 - iii. Susan Connor O'Laughlin was born about 1959 and married Robert Kelly.
 - iv. Brian Michael O'Laughlin was born about 1957 and married Mimi.
 - v. Martin Pius O'Laughlin was born about 1955 and married Jennifer born about 1957. Dr. Martin is a pediatric cardiologist in Kansas City.
 - 1. Molly O'Laughlin was born in about 1990.
- f. Joseph Patrick Connor was born January 1, 1929 in Kansas City, Missouri and died April 23, 1929 in Kansas City, Missouri.
- g. Patricia M. Connor was born March 3, 1931 in Kansas City, Missouri and died June 12, 2011 in Kansas City, Missouri. She married John L. Fitzgerald on February 4, 1956 in Kansas City, Missouri.
 - i. Sean Stephen Fitzgerald was born in 1956 in Kansas City, Missouri and died in 1975 in Kansas City, Missouri.
- h. Ruth C. Connor was born about 1934.

Ellen Christopher died June 15, 1880 and James Christopher died May 25, 1880. It is not presently known where the Christophers resided subsequent to John and Mary Connor's marriage. The Christophers were buried in a plot at St. Joseph's Cemetery in Shawnee, Kansas. Other members of the Christopher family were later buried in this plot, which is adjacent to the Connor family plot. This suggests the families remained close and that the Christophers were living in the area. The Christophers lived in Jackson County, Missouri in the 1860 census and in Shawnee, Wyandotte County in the 1870 census.

By 1908, all of the Connor boys had left Lenexa except Edward and Arthur. Ellen, James, Matthew, Charles, and their families, were living in the town of Rosedale, Kansas, which was just across the county line, about ten miles to the northeast of Lenexa. Later in 1908, Arthur left Lenexa to work as a steam fitter in Kansas City. In 1909, John and Mary retired from the farm and moved to a home on the Kansas side of State Line Road, in Rosedale. They became members of Holy Name parish and attended the dedication of Holy Name's new church on June 2, 1909. They were residing in Rosedale in 1913 when local residents voted for the annexation of Rosedale by Kansas City, Kansas. Both of these events became subjects for poems written by John Connor, who was nearly eighty years old.

George R. Dagnia and Mary McGrath Dagnia Manley

Mary McGrath was born November 2, 1859, in Lafayette County, Missouri. She was the first daughter of Daniel McGrath (1822-1923) and Mary Elizabeth Carson (1840-1912). On January 3, 1883, she married **George R. Dagnia** in Denver, Colorado. She had two daughters, Mary Elizabeth and Louise Beatrice, both born in Denver. After 1886, George Dagnia abandoned his family. Mary Dagnia later married a Mr. Frank Manley. She died July 15, 1936 of "Lock Bowel" in Kansas City, Missouri, and is buried in St. Joseph's Cemetery in Shawnee, Kansas.


The O'Connor family prior to 1650 was located on a large farm between Oulart and Ferns, County Wexford. Following the unsuccessful rebellion against the British Crown led by Oliver Cromwell, they lost this farm, which was given to Cromwell's English supporters. It appears that the O'Connors managed to secure a smaller farm in Garryhubbock in the 1650s. Garryhubbock translated from Irish means tobacco garden, it is probably tobacco that tobacco was grown there. The O'Connor family were heavily involved in the 1798 rebellion against the British. Three of the O'Connors from Garryhubbock were killed in action, but they left a 14-year-old boy, Bryan O'Connor (1784-1845) at home to look after the farm. All the O'Connors are descended from this young man. He was the father of John, James, and Thaddeus Jeremiah Connor who emigrated to America and also of Matthew, Lawrence, Johanna, and Mary O'Connor who remained at home. Matthew O'Connor (1824-1899) was the eldest son and a brother of John Connor, who was Pat's grandfather, making him her grand uncle. Bryan O'Connor (1866-1939) was Matthew's son and a brother of my (the source for this) grandfather Matthew. My grandfather, Matthew O'Connor, was involved in the 1916 uprising and was incarcerated in a prisoner-of-war camp by the British in Scotland and Wales between May and December 1916. He was also involved as a political

activist in a new party called Sinn Fein, which eventually won the 1918 elections. He fought in the Irish War of Independence against the Crown forces, which eventually secured Irish freedom in 1921. Garryhubbock was used as a secret depot for Irish Volunteer guns in the period.

James Christopher and Ellen Power Christopher

James Christopher was born in 1822 in Armore, County Waterford, Ireland to Thomas Christopher and Margaret Fitzgerald. He died of pneumonia on May 25, 1880 in Rosedale, Wyandotte County, Kansas. Family tradition holds that John, Mary and James considered moving to Oregon, but then heard there was good farmland available in Johnson County, Kansas, a few miles to the southwest, and decided to settle there.

James arrived in New York, New York on May 17, 1875 on the ship City of Richmond. He left from Queensland, Ireland.
