There are some lesser known kings among the Fitzpatrick ancestors. Barnaby Fitzpatrick (born Irish: Brían Óg Mac Giolla Phádraig) (c.1485–1575) was the last person to have claim to the kingship of Osraige; forfeiting his ancestral title in favor of being created the first Lord Baron Upper Ossory by King Henry VIII of England, by patent dated 11 June 1541, as part of the King's policy of Surrender and regrant. Barnaby Fitzpatrick was subsequently knighted on 1 July 1543.

Osraige anglicized as Ossory, was a medieval Irish kingdom comprising what is now County Kilkenny and western County Laois, corresponding to the Diocese of Ossory. The home of the Osraige people, it existed from around the first century. It was ruled by the Dál Birn dynasty, whose medieval descendants assumed the surname Mac Giolla Phádraig.

Family migration

Our story of the Fitzpatricks begins in 1666 in Ossary, Ulster, Northern Ireland with the birth of Hugh McDonald Fitzpatrick. Ulster is in the northern part of Ireland. Between 1694 and 1698 the Hugh McDonald Fitzpatrick family came to America. An undated document shows that they landed in Baltimore, Maryland. William came to America about 1715 with his wife's brother Alexander Breckenridge. He came, not as an immigrant, but as a gentleman who came to Virginia on his own initiative after earlier colonization. They probably first settled in what is now Fluvanna County, Virginia. They left Virginia for Pennsylvania in 1728 and left Philadelphia, Pennsylvania by 1729 and settled in Staunton, Augusta County, Virginia. Augusta County is in western Virginia. Around 1738 they moved to Goochland County, Virginia. During the next few years county names and boundaries changed so that the (William and Thomas) Fitzpatricks lived in Albemarle, Fluvanna, Green, and finally Culpeper Counties sometimes without moving at all. By 1774 the family, now led by John Fitzpatrick, moved east to Bath and Botetourt Counties, Virginia. By 1795 the family moved to Hawkins County, Tennessee. By 1828 the John Fitzpatrick family settled and stayed near Prestonburg, Floyd County, Kentucky. In 1828 the Jacob Fitzpatrick family moved to Hawkins County, Tennessee. By 1835 the family lived in Rushville, Rush County, Indiana where Nancy Jane Fitzpatrick was born. Jacob died in 1845 in Hancock County, Indiana. In 1857 Nancy Jane Fitzpatrick and Daniel Ulrey Hutchinson married and lived in Bloomfield, Davis County, Iowa. By 1868 they lived in Braymer, Caldwell County, Missouri where Hiram Benjamin Hutchinson was born. Braymer is about 30 miles northeast of Kansas City. In 1869 the Hutchinson family moved to a farm near Argonia, Sumner County, Kansas. In 1889 Hiram Benjamin Hutchinson made the Oklahoma Land Rush and filed a claim near Carrier, Garfield County, Oklahoma. In 1889 the family moved to Enid, Garfield County, Oklahoma and in 1910 moved to Wichita, Sedgwick County, Kansas.

He died on 16 Jul 1893 in Argonia, Kansas.

Jacob Fitzpatrick was born on 20 Dec 1792 in Bath County, Virginia. He died on 01 Jan 1845 in Hancock County, Indiana. He first married Sarah Sally Hamilton in 1813. She was born on 21 Sep 1794 in Hawkins, Tennessee. She died in 1817 in Floyd County, Kentucky. He then married **Lurana Hawood** (also Haywood), daughter of William Haywood and Mary Denny on 30 Oct 1818 in Prestonburg, Floyd County, Kentucky. She was born on 01 Mar 1795 in Virginia. She died on 27 Jan 1882 in Braymer, Caldwell County, Missouri.

Jacob Fitzpatrick was born to John Fitzpatrick Sr. and Sarah Denny Davis. Jacob married Sarah Sally Hamilton and had one child Jonathan Hamilton Fitzpatrick

Jacob and Lurana had ten children, with one set of triplets. In the 1850 Census the family lived in Bloomfield, Davis, Iowa. In the census children Pharoah, Lucinda, Euel, Nancy Jane, and Martha lived at home. In the 1880 federal census Ranna Fitzpatrick is listed as living with her daughter Nancy and her husband Daniel Ulrey Hutchinson in Caldwell County, Missouri.

Jacob's nephew is William H. Fitzpatrick. He was born in 1821 in Hawkins County, Tennessee, the son of Jacob's brother Jonathan Fitzpatrick and his wife Agnes Hawood, the sister of Lurana Hawood. William died in 1894. He married Rebecca Sparks, daughter of Zachariah Sparks and Elizabeth Carter in 1847. She was born in 1825.

There are several marriages between the Fitzpatrick and the Haywood and Sparks families. In the previous generation siblings Lurana, Lewis, and Agnes Haywood married siblings Jacob, Elizabeth, and Jonathan Fitzpatrick. The situation with the Sparks is more complicated. Cousins Laurania Mary and William H. Fitzpatrick (father Jonathan grandfather John) married siblings Stephen and Rebecca Sparks (father Zachariah). Jonathan Fitzpatrick (son of Jacob and Sally Hamilton) married Sarah Ann Sparks, sister of Stephen and Rebecca. Isaac Newton Fitzpatrick (father Joseph grandfather John) married the daughter Lurana Elizabeth Sparks of Stephen Sparks. That is, Isaac Newton Fitzpatrick married his nephew's daughter. In the 1880 census Isaac Newton Fitzpatrick lived next door to his brother-in-law William Wallace Sparks, the son of Stephen Sparks. Lucinda Fitzpatrick married William Sparks probably not closely related to the Sparks above.

Lurana Hawood, Lewis Haywood, and Agnes Haywood are siblings. They lived with Daniel Ulrey Hutchinson and daughter Nancy Jane in Fairview, Caldwell County, Missouri in the 1880 Census.

Sister of Agnes Haywood married to Jonathan Fitzpatrick. Known in census as Livience and Lovina. Also called Rainey.

Jacob Fitzpatrick and Lurana Hawood had the following children:

2. Laurania Mary Fitzpatrick was born in 1822 in Hawkins County, Tennessee. She died in 1892 in Missouri. She married Stephen Sparks, son of Zachariah Sparks and Elizabeth Carter on 21 Sep 1843 in Livingston, Missouri. He was born in 1821 in Franklin, Indiana. He died in 1859 in Chillicothe, Livingston, Missouri.
3. Pharoah Fitzpatrick was born in 1828 in Hawkins County, Tennessee. He died in 1890 in Marion County, Oregon.

4. Lucinda Fitzpatrick was born on 18 Sep 1832 in Appanoose County, Iowa. She died 15 Nov. 1872 in Caldwell County, Missouri. She married William Sparks. He was born on 22 Aug. 1830 in Ohio. He died in 12 Jan 1892 in Caldwell County, Missouri.
5. Euel Lewis Fitzpatrick was born in 1835 in Rush, Indiana. He died on 22 Nov 1904 in Caldwell County, Missouri. He married Emma C. Toner. She died in 1875. Also called Ewell.
6. Martha Angeline Fitzpatrick was born in 1838 in Rush, Indiana. She died in 1909. She married Phillip Purcell in 1855. He was born in 27 Dec 1827 in Ohio and died 22 Feb 1886 in Missouri.
7. **Nancy Jane Fitzpatrick** was born on 18 Mar 1838 in Rushville, Rush County, Indiana. She died on 29 Jul 1909 in Argonia, Kansas. She married **Daniel Ulrey Hutchinson**, son of James Adrian Hutchinson and Sarah Ulrey on 30 Jul 1857 in Bloomfield, Davis County, Ohio. He was born on 06 Apr 1825 in Warren Co, Ohio. He died on 16 Jul 1893 in Argonia, Kansas.

Jacob Fitzpatrick and Sarah Sally Hamilton had the following children:

1. Jonathan Hamilton Fitzpatrick was born July 10, 1816 in Floyd, Kentucky. He died August 21, 1861 in Appanoose, Iowa. He married Sarah Ann Sparks, daughter of Zachariah Sparks and Elizabeth Carter on 05 Sep 1840 in Hancock County, Indiana. She was born in 1823 in Indiana. She died on 08 Aug 1897 in Appanoose, Iowa.
2. Thomas H. Fitzpatrick was born in 1817 in Floyd, Kentucky and died March 1, 1875 in Douglas, Kansas. He married Nancy Leonard. She was born in 1819 in Hancock County, Indiana.

Generation 3

John Fitzpatrick was born in Jan 1758 in Culpepper County, Virginia. He died in 1828 in Prestonburg, Floyd County, Kentucky. He married Mary Cavandish in 1773. She was born in 1760 in Virginia. She died in 1790 in Virginia. He married **Sarah Sally Denny**, daughter of James Denny and Ann Sturgis in about 1784. She was born in 1762 in Amherst, Virginia. She died on 01 Jan 1849 in Clinton, Floyd County, Kentucky.

Sarah Sally Denny Davis was probably married to a man named John Davis before marrying John Fitzpatrick. John and Sarah were married in 1784 also in Culpepper County. John died in 1828 and Sarah died in 1848. Both are buried in Langley Cemetery, Middle Creek, Floyd County, Kentucky. His name appeared in the 1820 Federal Census. John Fitzpatrick is a Revolutionary War veteran.

The Fitzpatricks and Spradlins were considered some of the pioneer families of the Highlands of Eastern Kentucky and Southwest Virginia. They traveled with many other families during this time through Pound Gap from Virginia to what is now Letcher County, Kentucky. This is the headwater of the Kentucky, Big Sandy, and Cumberland Rivers. The Levisa River is here as well. The Fitzpatricks and Spradlins settled in what has remained Floyd County. Letcher County and others were formed from this area.

John probably lived for a while in Bath County, Virginia and Hawkins County Tennessee before Floyd County, Kentucky. He fought in Dunmore's War in Henderson's Company. Dunmore's War (or Lord Dunmore's War) was a war from 1774 to 1775 between the Colony of Virginia and the Indian nations of the Shawnee and Mingo. The House of Burgesses was asked by Lord Dunmore, the Governor of Virginia, to declare a state of war with the hostile Indian nations and order up an elite volunteer militia force for the campaign. He was a DAR number 425305 application 752054 veteran listed as Pvt CT DAR Patriot Index 1758. John was a full-blooded Irishman. He was in the War of 1812.

Taken from DAR Application for Jeanne McClanahan. The Fitzpatrick Farm - The Battle of Middle Creek (10 Jan 1862) was fought on land owned by Henry Clay Fitzpatrick (1823-1895), son of Jonathan Fitzpatrick and grandson of Bath Co., Va., native John Fitzpatrick, Revolutionary War veteran, who established a farm here sometime before 1800. John is buried on Graveyard Point, Garfield's command post during battle. Henry's son

Hiram H. Fitzpatrick, Floyd County Clerk, inherited the farm and passed it to his son Henry D. Fitzpatrick, Sr. and daughter Osa F. Ligon. Next owners were Henry D. Fitzpatrick, Jr., president of The Bank Josephine, and Osa's daughter, Sally Ligon Clarke. The farm is now owned by Middle Creek National Battlefield Foundation, founded in 1992 by Franklin D. Fitzpatrick, son of H. D. Fitzpatrick, Jr.

6. Elizabeth Fitzpatrick was born in 1798 in Hawkins County, Tennessee. She married Lewis Haywood, son of William Haywood and Mary Denny on 24 Sep 1816 in Floyd County, Kentucky. He was born in 1794 in Hawkins County, Tennessee. He died in 1880 in Floyd County, Kentucky.
7. Jonathan Fitzpatrick was born in 1801 in Tennessee. He died in 1824 in Magoffin County, Kentucky. He married Agnes Haywood (Hawood). She was born in 1797 in Virginia. She died in 1850 in Floyd, Kentucky.

8. Joseph Fitzpatrick was born in 1807 in Tennessee. He married Mary Fitzpatrick. She was born in 1810 in Virginia.

Lurana Hawood (William), Lewis Haywood (Elizabeth), and Agnes Haywood (Jonathan) are siblings.

Thomas Joseph Fitzpatrick was born in 1720 in Fluvanna County, Virginia. He died in Dec 1797 in Albemarle County, Virginia. He married **Elizabeth Henley Hamner**, daughter of William Hamner and Mary Elizabeth Hendley in Sussex, Virginia. She was born in 1725 in Albemarle, Virginia. She died on 03 Jun 1813 in Albemarle County, Virginia.

More research needs to be done on the birth date of Elizabeth. Most sources list her birth in 1761. Her first child appears to be born in 1744. She is also listed as Mary Elizabeth Henley Hamner and as Elizabeth Henley Hammer. The last name has varied among Hamner, Hanmer, and Hammer. The Web site

Generation 4

William Fitzpatrick was born in 1694 in Ossary, Ulster, Northern, Ireland. He was the son of Hugh McDonald Fitzpatrick and Elizabeth McMahan. He died on 09 Aug 1764 in Albemarle, Virginia. He married **Sarah Jane Breckenridge**, daughter of John Breckenridge and Ann Doak in 1709 in Ireland. She was born in 1690 in Breadalbane, Perthshire, Scotland. She died in 1720 in Albemarle, Virginia.

William Fitzpatrick was born in 1694 in Ossary, Ulster, Northern Ireland, a probable descendant of an Earl of Ossary. He was a landowner-farmer in Ulster. He married Sarah Jane Breckenridge, a sister of the immigrant Alexander Breckenridge, in 1709. They had sons Thomas, William and Joseph, and three daughters, whose names are not known. William and his sons had left the church of their fathers and were Presbyterians. Family tradition says that Fitzpatrick came, not as an immigrant but as a gentleman who came to Virginia about 1715 on his own initiative after the earlier colonization with his father Hugh McDonald Fitzpatrick. In 1728 the family moved to Pennsylvania. In 1729 they moved to Staunton, Augusta County, Virginia with Alexander Breckenridge. They did not receive any headrights or grants, acquiring all their property by purchase.

Sarah Jane's father is the great, great grandfather of John Cabell Breckenridge. John Cabell Breckinridge (January 16, 1821 – May 17, 1875) was an American lawyer, politician, and soldier. He represented Kentucky in both houses of Congress and became the 14th and youngest-ever vice president of the United States, serving from 1857 to 1861. He was a member of the Democratic party. He served in the U.S. Senate during the outbreak of the American Civil War, but was expelled after joining the Confederate Army. He was appointed Confederate secretary of war in 1865. The family came to this country in about 1728. The family originated in Ayrshire, Scotland, migrated to the highlands of Scotland to Breadalbane Scotland, later to the North of Ireland. The Fitzpatricks and Breckenridges migrated to this country via Philadelphia, later passing on to Virginia by way of Staunton, then east again to Albemarle County.

William Fitzpatrick's will:

Son, Thomas I constitute and appoint my sole executor, trustee and manager for my dear wife after my decease, who I doubt not will manage it with all requirements necessary unto my worldly Estate. I will, and positively order that all my lawful debts be paid with my funeral charges. Item - all the remainder of my estate I will and bequeath to my well beloved wife, Sarah Fitzpatrick during her natural life to be at will and disposal as she thinks proper and at her decease to will and dispose of this named at her pleasure to whom it pleaseth her heart to do.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventh day of December, and year of our Lord, One Thousand and seven hundred and sixty-two.

Will Fitzpatrick.

This will was proved by the oath of Sam'l Gay (Loucy' husband), son William Fitzpatrick and John Harris. Ordered to be recorded the ninth day of August, 1764. Certificate granted to Thomas Fitzpatrick on making oath and giving security according to law whereupon his son, Thomas, Joseph Fitzpatrick his security.

There is no mention of daughters, but there being no division of the estate, there could have been. They are found first in Goochland, and later Albemarle, then Fluvanna County. He is buried near the James River in Fluvanna County.

In 1777 Fluvanna County was created from a part of Albemarle. Then in 1785 the land was sold to Duncan McLaughlin located on the middle fork of Cunningham's Creek, bounded by lands of Robert Allen, Robert Wright, Joseph Fitzpatrick and Merewether. This is the land on which Joseph Fitzpatrick died, and on which was a grist mill that Joseph operated in what is now Fluvanna County.

William Fitzpatrick and Sarah Jane Breckenridge had the following children:

1. Joseph Fitzpatrick was born in 1710 in Goochland, Virginia. He died in 1778 in Greensboro, Fluvanna, Virginia. He married Mary Perrin Woodson (called Molly). She was born in 1732 in Edinburgh, York, Virginia. She died in 1780 in Greensboro, Greene, Georgia.

Notes for Joseph Fitzpatrick:

Joseph was only five years old when his family came from Ireland. Another document says Joseph migrated from Ireland to Virginia, at the age of seven years. The family came via Philadelphia, then westward, turning south along the Shenandoah Valley to present Staunton, Augusta County, Virginia, thence to Goochland.

It would seem that the Fitzpatricks and their party assumed the ways of the earlier German settlers, for building log cabins, girdling trees to clear land quickly started the practice of planting tobacco as a cash crop, no doubt learned from their friends and family arriving from the tidewater. Land was tedious to clear, as slow as an acre a year, if trees were cut and stumps pulled.

In 1749 Joseph was a tavern keeper. On Nov.1, 1781 Joseph's will was proved, Fluvanna County, Virginia. (Will book 1, 1777-1808.pp 34-37, Fluvanna County, Virginia)

"In the name of God, Amen. I Joseph Fitzpatrick, of Fluvanna County, Virginia being weak of body, but in perfect mind and memory, calling to mind that once appointed for all men to dye, do make this my last will and testament in the manner following.

First, if it should please the Lord to take me from Time I recommend my Body to the Earth and my soul to God who gave it to me. As touching such Worldly Goods as it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me with I give in the manner which followeth, viz.,

Item- To my son Benjamin, I give one Negro boy named Nicholes to him and said Benjamin and his heirs forever.

Item- To my son William, I give one Negro boy named John to him, the said William and his heirs forever.

Item- to my son Joseph, I give one Negro boy named Tobey, to him the said Joseph and his heirs forever.

Item- I give to my sons William and Joseph one thousand acres of land lying at Martin Kings River Fork to be equally divided between my two sons and their heirs forever.

Item- To my daughter Elizabeth Hurd I give Ten Pounds current money.

Item- I lend to my daughter, Molly Wright, the land where she now lives and one

Negro girl, Tilly, during her life, and then said land and Negro and her increase if any be equally divided among her said daughters, children to them and their heirs forever. Item- to my grandson, William Heard, son of George Heard, if it should please God he should live to the age of eighteen years, then I give to him and his heirs forever one Negro girl named Agnes and should he die before arriving at that age, my will and desire is that said girl Agnes should then go to Joseph Heard, son of Thomas Heard to him, the said Joseph and his heirs forever.

Item- To my sons Booth and Rene I give them the land, mill and plantation whereon I live. It containing three hundred acres to them and said Booth and Rene and the two colts they have in possession. Also I give to my said sons one entry of land I have on the Middle Creek also another entry I have on the North River to them and their heirs forever.

Item- I give to my sons, Boothe, and Rene Negro Fibey, and her girl Fibey Gene a Negro wench, said Negroes to be equally divided among sons Boothe and Rene after my wife decease. Also to those to them and their heirs forever.

Item- I give to my loving wife, Molly Fitzpatrick, a Negro wench named Sarah during her life, and after my wife's decease, I give the said Negro wench to my son, William, and his heirs forever.

Item- I give my sons, William and Joseph a cow and a calf, each and all the rest of my stock and household furniture to remain with my wife during her life and then to be equally divided between Boothe and Rene.

Item- I give to my wife my riding mare and my old mare to my son, William.

Item- Ready money I now am in possession of I put to the use of paying my just debts. Also my old house land, it contains 265 acres be sold, and the money arising from said sale to be put to the use of paying my debts and my Negroes to remain in the possession of my wife during her lifetime, names, Tobey, Molly, Fibey, Geney, Sarah. My desire is that my son Rene should have twelve months schooling.

I appoint my sons, William Fitzpatrick, Joseph Fitzpatrick, Boothe Fitzpatrick executors of my last will and testament with my wife Molly executrix of the same, in testimony whereof I have put hereunto set by hand and seal this August 17, 1779. Signed, sealed and acknowledged in the presence of J. Napier and Champin Napier, Signed, J. Fitzpatrick L. S."

At a court held before Fluvanna Thursday the first day of November, 1781 this writing was this day presented to court and proved to be the last will and testament of Joseph Fitzpatrick, deceased, by the oath of John Napier and Benjamin Fitzpatrick, heir at law to this. Recorded in Fluvanna County, Virginia. Will Book I, page 34, 5, 6, 7.

3. **Thomas Joseph Fitzpatrick** was born in 1720 in Virginia. He died in Dec 1797 in Albemarle County, Virginia. He married **Elizabeth Henley Hamner**, daughter of William Hamner and Mary Elizabeth Hendley in Sussex, Virginia, USA. She was born in 1761 in Albemarle, Virginia, USA. She died on 03 Jun 1813 in Albemarle County, Virginia.

Hugh McDonald Fitzpatrick was born in 1666 in Ossary, Ulster, Northern Ireland. He died in 1698 in Maryland. He is the son of Lawrence John Fitzpatrick (1640-1694) and Elizabeth Baroness Butler (1612-1675). He married **Elizabeth McMahan** in 1691 in Ireland. She was born in 1670 in Ireland. She died in Maryland. She was the daughter of Colla Dubh, Lord of Dartry McMahan and Eileen Eibhlin Aileen O' Reilly.

Sometime between 1694 and 1698 the Hugh Fitzpatrick family came to America. An undated document shows that they landed in Baltimore, Maryland.

Hugh McDonald Fitzpatrick and Elizabeth McMahan had the following child:

1. **William Fitzpatrick** was born in 1694 in Northern, Ireland. He died on 09 Aug 1764 in Albemarle, Virginia. He married **Sarah Jane Breckenridge**, daughter of John Breckenridge and Ann Doak in 1709 in Virginia. She was born in 1690 in Breadalbane, Perthshire, Scotland. She died in 1720 in Albemarle, Fluvanna, Virginia.
